WORKING ON YOUR PHD*

2016 – 2017 CHALLENGE

This is a chance for you to turn your PHD's (Project Half Done) into finished pieces. All you have to do is make a list of your unfinished projects that are just waiting to be completed. You know the ones. They are hanging around in your head or cluttering up your closets. They make you feel guilty but you still haven't finished them. Well...you can now clear your conscience. Join us for this fun challenge and earn your PHD* from the Langley Quilter's Guild. Not only will you be able to show off your finished projects but you can brag that you have earned your PHD* and will receive a diploma to prove it!

How do you participate? It's easy!!!

- Complete a registration form and list 10 unfinished items that you would like to complete. If you have a very large project you can break it down into several steps and spread it out over several months. Items must already be in progress (ie fabric must be cut before the challenge starts in August)
- Beside each item list the steps that you will complete that month.
- Bring your registration form to the Challenge Committee at the next Guild meeting.
**Make and keep a copy of this form for yourself so that you know what you need to work on each month.
- You will have 1 month to complete each item you have listed
- Bring your completed work to the next Guild meeting and check in with the Challenge Committee and have it marked as completed
- Show your completed work at Show & Tell
- Every item completed earns you a ballot for a random prize draw to take place June 2017. The more items you complete the better your chances of winning.
- To receive your PHD* diploma you must complete 10 items.
- One of your items must be a project for Community Quilts and can be done any month that you choose.
- If you are unable to attend the Guild meeting but have completed the item for that month you can email a picture to one of the committee members so that it can be counted
- If your item isn't conducive to bringing to the meeting or show and tell (eg blocks are pieced and arranged on a design wall) then a picture showing your completed steps can be shown to a committee member and counted
- All Guild members can participate and you can join at any time
